- I. Call to Order: The meet ng was called to order by Chair Peter Broadbent at 8:35 a.m.
- II. Information Items:
 - A. **FY2025 CCRP Grants Cycle:** Dr. Metz reported that the new grants cycle will begin on October 16, 2025. For new board members he described the Circuit Court Records Preservat on Program (CCRP) as part of the Library of Virginia's Local Records Services Branch. Funded through a \$3.50 of the derk's recordat on fee, the CCRP provides resources to help preserve and make accessible permanent circuit court records. The program awards grants to the Commonwealth's circuit court derks to help them address the needs of the records housed in their localit es.
 - B. NEH National Digital Newspaper Project Grant: Dr. Metz shared the Library received a \$235,692 grant from the Nat onal Endowment for the Humanites (NEH) for a two-year project to digit ze 100,000 pages of historical Virginia imprint newspapers dat ng from 1860–1963.
 - C. Long Term Exhibition Task Force: He reported the task force has completed their white paper and will meet with the Librarian of Virginia to discuss their findings and evaluate their proposed next steps.
 - D. Updated Collections Policy: The policy is under review and will be shared electronically with all board members for review prior to any vote.
 - E. **State Records Center Expansion Project Update:** The project will be open to bidders next week, and the Library hopes to engage a contractor by January 2026.

Future Business: Mr. Brockwell expressed an interest in having the commit ee review the cert ficat on requirements for professional librarians in Virginia Las currently art culated in the Code of Virginia (§ 42.1-15.1). He'd like for the commit ee or a smaller task force to explore the cert ficat on's origins, purpose, current relevance, and current/future applicability.

- I. **Call to Order:** Vice Chair Trumbo convened the meet ng at 9.30 a.m. He opened the meet ng with introduct ons and asked Mr. Hinderliter to provide an overview of the following topics.
- II. Statement of Financial Condition (Closeout of FY24): The close out of FY2024 showed an overall increase in General Funds which were provided to the Library for IT needs, pay increases and increased state aid payments to local public libraries across Virginia. The charts provided indicate less than full spending of federal, special and circuit court records program funds. All these unexpended balances remain with the Library and were due primarily to t ming of payments. Federal spending is stat c across fiscal years, and variances of spending to appropriat on are at ributable to the t ming of the federal fiscal year not aligning with the state fiscal year. The large increase in CCRP spending is primarily due to incurred but not expended grants awarded to local courts in prior years.
- III. LSTA Proposed Budget for FFY25: The proposed LSTA budget for FY2O25 was shared with the group. The budget includes 15 separate tasks/projects that are in alignment with the Five-Year Plan previously submit ed to and approved by the Inst tute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). The overall amount awarded to Virginia form the IMLS is down approximately \$30,000 dollars from the prior year. Combined with inflat on and salary increases, the overall impact of federal dollars is decreasing. The proposed budget does not vary greatly from the prior year but does include a line item to account for vacancy savings. Af er some discussion, the commit ee considered a mot on made by Ms. Denslow and seconded to approve the LSTA budget as presented. It passed unanimously.
- IV. Capital Projects Updates on State Records Center and 800 E. Broad Street: For the capital project expansion of the State Records Center, Dr. Metz informed the group of the invitat on for bid scheduled to close on Thursday, Sept. 26, 2024. The state process would involve bid reviews, background checks and other administrat ve funct ons that could take up to six weeks before bid award.
- V. Adjournment: Hearing no addit onal business, Mr. Trumbo adjourned the meet ng at 10.20 a.m.

Honoring the Outstanding Contributions of Conley L. Edwards III to the Library of Virginia

WHEREAS Conley L. Edwards III has served dutifully as an archivist and supporter of the Library of Virginia for 50 years; and

WHEREAS Mr. Edwards graduated from Hampden-Sydney College with a Bachelor of Arts degree and later earned a Master of Arts degree in American history from the University of Richmond; and

He noted it is very unusual for any library to be awarded three large federal grants at the same t me and applauded the e ect ve collaborat on between sta and the Foundat on. He spoke briefly about progress on the new strategic plan, which will be shared in November, and the ongoing review of the Library's Collect on Development Policy which will be shared electronically. In response to a board member's quest on on the Library's use of AI, Mr. Clark shared that the Library hosted a very successful workshop Envisioning Your Ancestors which used AI and writ en descript ons to build an image of part cipants' ancestors. The workshop is short-listed for a RVA Technology Award.
- X. Report of the Chair: Mr. Brockwell reported on his experience of recent programming including the closing recept on for the Indigenous Perspect ves Exhibit, the 60th Anniversary Commemorat on of the Desegregat on of Brunswick High School, and the latest Weinstein Author Series event, *Boardinghouse Women*. He announced the Execut ve Commit ee will meet

in October to prepare for the November board meet ng. At the close of his report, he provided two resolut ons for the Patron of Let ers degree awards to Mr. Reginald Bet s and Ms. Adriana Trigiani. The board approved Mr. Bet 's award in June. Ms. Denslow moved the approval of the award for Ms. Trigiani and the resolut ons for both Ms. Trigiani and Mr. Bet s. The mot on was seconded. WHEREAS Section 42.1-3.1 of the Code of Virginia gives the Library Board authority to confer an honorary Patron of Letters degree to anyone who, in the Board's opinion, has made an outstanding contribution in the realm of history, library science, or archival science; and

WHEREAS Reginald Dwayne Betts, a poet, memoirist, lawyer and the founder of Freedom Reads, has demonstrated remarkable resilience and extraordinary commitment to his fellow humans through his efforts to create Freedom Libraries for the benefit of individuals who are incarcerated in the Commonwealth of Virginia and beyond; and WHEREAS Mr. Betts has authored a memoir and three collections of poetry exploring the world of prison and the effects of incarceration on American society and his own experience after being tried as an adult at 16 and spending many of his years in solitary confinement; and

WHEREAS Mr. Betts has devoted himself to ensure others have access to the books that saved his life while incarcerated as a young man, graduating from Yale University School of Law and being honored for his work in 2021 with a MacArthur Grant; and

WHEREAS Mr. Betts serves as a powerful example of how literature and access to libraries can transform lives and how his experiences inspired him to promote the humanity and rights of individuals who are or have been incarcerated and often feel forgotten; and

WHEREAS he founded the organization Freedom Reads to give people who are incarcerated access to the power of literature by donating shelving and libraries, organizing author visits, and setting up book circles in prisons and juvenile detention facilities; and

WHEREAS Mr. Betts and Freedom Reads have donated 345 Freedom Libraries in 41 prisons and juvenile detention facilities across 12 states, including 56 Freedom Libraries in Virginia Department of Corrections facilities; and WHEREAS he has created a locus for conversation and community within these underserved and overlooked communities in prisons through beautiful, handcrafted libraries populated with a 500-book curated collection; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Library Board on this 20th day of September 2024 that the Board recognizes Reginald D. Betts' outstanding contribution to libraries by conferring on him the honorary patron of letters degree; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting, and that the Patron of Letters degree be presented to Reginald D. Betts by the Library Board at the Library's annual Literary Awards Celebration on September 21, 2024.

WHEREAS Adriana Trigiani is a bestselling author, director, playwright, and podcast host who has demonstrated remarkable creative energy and prolific works that have inspired an international following of appreciative readers and listeners, and encouraged readers young and old to engage and enjoy various forms of literature; and WHEREAS Ms. Trigiani began her writing career as a playwright in 1985 at the Manhattan Theater Club with Secrets of a Lava Lamp and sold her first screenplay, Three to Get Married, in 1986; her first nonfiction work came from the heart when she wrote and directed the documentary Queens of the Big Time, which was based on her grandfather's 16 millimeter films of his hometown, Roseto, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS Adriana Trigiani's novels are beloved by millions of readers and published in 38 countries around the world, and her first novel, Big Stone Gap, was written about her Virginia hometown and would be adapted into a movie that Ms. Trigiani wrote and directed while it was filmed on location in the Commonwealth with an all-star cast, including Ashley Judd, Whoopi Goldberg, and Patrick Wilson; and

WHEREAS Ms. Trigiani is the New York Times bestselling author of 20 books in fiction and nonfiction, adult and children's books, and a cookbook; she is also the host of the hit podcast You Are What You Read, sponsored by Book of the Month; and

WHEREAS she has created a vast body of work accessible to everyone in libraries throughout the world; and she has shared her stories and humor, encouraged discussions, developed communities, and created opportunities for literary exploration and learning; and

WHEREAS Adriana Trigiani co-founded the Origin Project in 2013 with Nancy Bolmeier Fisher, a project that has developed creative writing skills of more than 1,700 students in the Appalachian Mountains of Virginia by connecting students with professional authors through programs, events and mentoring; and

WHEREAS Ms. Trigiani has given selflessly of her time and talent in service of the Library of Virginia, serving as a longtime host of the annual Virginia Literary Awards; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Library Board on this 20th day of September 2024 that the Board recognizes Adriana Trigiani's outstanding contribution to libraries by conferring upon her the honorary Patron of Letters degree; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting, and that the Patron of Letters degree be presented to Adriana Trigiani by the Library Board at the Library's annual Literary Awards Celebration on September 21, 2024.
