WHEREAS, archivists and archival institutions work diligently to preserve and make the Commonwealth's documented history accessible to present and future generations of Virginians and others; and

WHEREAS, during the month of October, Virginians are encouraged to visit the many archival and special collections around the Commonwealth and to recognize the hard work of Virginia's archivists;
